Option D hence is the correct answer.

The last few words of the first sentence clearly states that we derive new column of energy from the goal that we discover or set for ourselves.

Option B hence is the correct answer.

Do not allow this energy to be dissipated in the futile memories of past regrets or failures nor in the imagined sorrow of the future or the present and thus bring the entire energy focussed into activity. That is the highest creative action in the world outside. Thereby the individual who is till now considered most inefficient finds his way to the highest achievement and success.

The writer clearly suggests from the last few words of the 2nd sentence of the 1st paragraph that 'brining all the energy into activity' is crucial to achieve success.

In the given context of the passage the most appropriate synonym to the word 'Surrender' is 'Submission' which means 'the action of accepting or yielding to a superior force or to the will or authority of another person.'

Dissipate (verb): (with reference to a feeling or emotion) to disappear or cause to disappear.

Ex. The concern she'd felt for him had wholly dissipated.

In the given context of the passage the most appopriate synonym to the word 'dissipated' is 'wasted'.

Option E hence is the correct answer.

Thereby the individual who is till now considered most inefficient finds his way to the highest achievement and success.

Inefficient (adjective):

not achieving maximum productivity; wasting or failing to make the best use of time or resources.

Ex. This part of the city has an inefficient transport system and it causes heavy traffic jams on roads.

In the given context of the passage the most appropriate synonym to the word Option A hence is the correct answer.
