Delegates bring the United Nations to life. Without them, this Organization would not be what it is. They negotiate agreements and coordinate with their home countries. Some form alliances, others struggle for compromises. In that way, they embody the multilateralism, which the UN stands for.

The delegates represent their countries in meetings at the United Nations. Unless a politician of higher rank is present, the delegates speak and vote on behalf of their country at the UN General Assembly, and other fora, such as the UN Security Council. The delegates are appointed by their countries. Hence, they follow the interests of the government they serve.



In order to raise awareness of the role of the representatives and delegates of the Member States to the United Nations, the UN General Assembly has proclaimed 25 April as International Delegate's Day.(Read more)

Who: Justice Nuthalapati Venkata Ramana

What: was sworn in as the 48th Chief Justice of India

When: published on 24th April 2021

Justice Nuthalapati Venkata Ramana was sworn in as the 48th Chief Justice of India on Saturday. Justice Ramana's will hold the post for sixteen months, until August 26, 2022.

Justice Ramana takes over at a time when the judiciary is going back to a virtual mode, due to the second wave of Covid-19, and is entrusted with ensuring un-interrupted access to justice. As Chairperson of the National Legal Services Authority, Justice Ramana led efforts to ensure training to lawyers and litigants to adapt to e-courts during the pandemic.

Born on August 27, 1957 in Ponnavaram of Krishna district in Andhra Pradesh, Justice Ramana is the youngest of three siblings. His parents Nuthalapati Ganapathi Rao and Sarojini were humble agriculturists. Although he briefly worked as a journalist for Telugu newspaper Eenadu, as a first generation lawyer, he enrolled as an advocate and set up practice in Vijayawada in 1983.(Read more)

Who: Hindustani classical vocalist Rajan Mishra

What: passes away in Delhi due to COVID-19, aged 70

Hindustani classical vocalist Rajan Mishra passed away in Delhi on Sunday at the age of 70, after being admitted to the city's St Stephen Hospital on reporting COVID-19 -related complications.

"Pandit Rajan Mishra ji passed away at around 6.30 in Delhi's St Stephen hospital. He had COVID-19 and was admitted to the hospital. He had taken the first dose of the vaccine about 15-20 days ago. He had a heart attack in the afternoon and he had another attack at around 5.30 pm," Mishra's nephew Amit told the Press Trust of India.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi took to Twitter to condole the death of the Padma Bhushan awardee, who, along with his brother Sajan formed the renowned Rajan-Sajan Mishra duo from Varanasi.(Read more)

What: to launch data relay satellite to track Gaganyaan

When: published on 25th April 2021

The Indian Space Research Organisation will launch a data relay satellite that will help maintain contact with the Gagangyaan mission throughout after the launch, sources said.

The satellite will be launched before the final leg of the Gaganyaan mission, which will send astronauts to the Lower Earth Orbit (LEO). The first leg -- the unmanned mission -- is to be launched in December.

"We're planning to launch our own satellite, which will act as a data relay satellite before going for the first human space flight," the sources said.

The Rs 800-crore project has been approved and work has been going on, they added. (Read more)

What: bags 11 medals tops Medals Tally at 2021 AIBA Youth World Boxing Championships

India's Sachin won the men's 56kg gold medal at the 2021 AIBA Youth World Boxing Championships

on Friday to take India's total medal haul at the event to 11.

Sachin's gold was India's eighth and capped a brilliant seven top podium finishes registered by the women pugilists at Kielce, Poland, on Thursday. Bishwamitra Chongthom (men's 49kg), Ankit

Narwal (men's 64kg) and Vishal Gupta (men's 91kg) won a bronze medal each.

This is the best ever tally recorded by the Indian boxers at the event, surpassing the 10 medal-haul

from the 2018 edition.

Sachin, who hails from Bhiwani, Haryana, made a cautious start against Kazakhstan boxer Yerbolat

Sabyr in the final. The Indian's swift footwork coupled with quick fierce punches put pressure on his

opponent.(Read more)

Who: Rafael Nadal

What: Wins 12th Barcelona Open Title, Beats Stefanos Tsitsipas

When: published on 26th April 2021



Rafael Nadal saved a championship point to beat Stefanos Tsitsipas 6-4, 6-7 (6/8), 7-5 on Sunday and claim a 12th Barcelona Open title in the ATP's longest match of 2021. The Spaniard secured his first title of the year and 87th of his career, denying Tsitsipas back-to-back triumphs following his maiden Masters 1000 title at Monte Carlo last week. Nadal avenged his Australian Open quarter-final loss to Tsitsipas and will return to second in the ATP rankings on Monday by climbing back above Daniil Medvedev after his marathon 3-hour 38-minute win.

"It means a lot for me to play the final here and win... I improved my level during the week and this trophy means a lot," said Nadal.

Nadal redeemed himself after a surprise quarter-final exit in Monte Carlo, but the three sets dropped en route to the title represented the most in any of his wins here. (Read more)

Who: China's First Mars Rover

What: Named 'Zhurong': Know the Meaning and Significance of Name

When: published on 24th April 2021

China has announced the name of its first Mars rover as Zhurong, which in Chinese tradition means the mythical god of fire and war. The solar-powered rover is aboard the Tianwen-1 probe that was launched in July 2020 and reached the red planet's orbit on February 24. It is likely to make a landing attempt in May. According to Chinese legend, Zhurong had the face of a man, the body of a beast, and rode on two dragons. His name was once used as the title for the minister of defense. The rover's name is in accordance with the Chinese name for Mars — "Huo Xing," or fire star, according to the China National Space Administration, which conducted an online survey to select the name. Zhurong was chosen over Hongyi, the name favoured by many space scientists in China and which means "to have an open mind".

The Tianwen-1 mission is part of China's ambitious space plans that include landing a human on the moon. After landing on the Martian surface, the probe will be looking for evidence of life such as water, ice and studying the climate and surface with its panoramic and multispectral cameras. If successful, China would become the third country after the former Soviet Union and the US to land a robot on Mars. In 2019, it landed a probe on the little-explored far side of the moon. Armenia's prime minister has resigned, a step necessary to hold snap parliamentary elections in

June.

Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan announced the June 20 elections last month to try to resolve

political tensions that arose after last year's defeat in a war with Azerbaijan.

Under a cease-fire signed by Pashinyan, Armenia ceded large swaths of territory in and around the

Nagorno-Karabakh region of Azerbaijan that had been under the control of ethnic Armenian forces

since the end of a separatist war in 1994.

The agreement sparked large protests calling for Pashinyan's ouster that persisted for

What: named new MD and CEO of NCDEX

When: published on 26th April 2021

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has approved the appointment of Arun Raste as the new Managing Director and CEO of National Commodity and Derivatives Exchange Ltd (NCDEX)

for five years.

He is currently Executive Director of the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) as Executive Director. Raste also serves as a director on the board at Indian Immunological Limited and Mother Dairy Fruit & Vegetable Pvt Ltd.Earlier, he worked with IDFC First Bank, Kotak Mahindra Bank, NABARD, ACC Cement, and non-profit NGO IRFT. Raste did his bachelor's and master's in

economics, and hold a post-graduate diploma in marketing management. (Read more)

What: won E-Panchayat Puraskar 2021

When: published on 14th April 2021

The Uttar Pradesh government on Tuesday said it has won the "E-Panchayat Puraskar 2021", ranking first in Category I. It was followed by Assam and Chhattisgarh at the second position, while

Odisha and Tamil Nadu stood third, the government said.

Every year, the Union Ministry of Panchayati Raj awards those states, which ensure maximum use of information technology to keep a tab on the work done by gram panchayats.



"This year, the Yogi Adityanath government has been awarded for flawless and efficient implementation of the e-application developed by the Centre and a few more apps developed by the state government," said a state government spokesperson. (Read more)

Who: Japan

What: approves third drug for COVID-19 treatment

When: published on 24th April 2021

The health ministry has approved the use of baricitinib, a rheumatoid drug, for treating COVID-19 patients, making it the third drug OK'd for use against the virus in the country after remdesivir and dexamethasone.

Baricitinib, sold under the brand name Olumiant, is currently administered to patients with rheumatoid arthritis or atopy. COVID-19 patients with moderate to severe symptoms will be given one dose per day of the drug.

In a clinical test, the use of baricitinib, together with remdesivir, has led to faster recovery of COVID-19 patients and lowered death rates among them.(Read more)

What: pledges Rs 135 crore in funding to help India fight Covid-19

When: published on 26th April 2021



As the Covid-19 crisis intensifies in India, tech companies are coming forward to offer help. Google has now announced Rs 135 crore in new funding for India, including two grants from Google.org, the philanthropic arm of the tech giant. The total amount from these grants is Rs 20 crore. The first one will go to GiveIndia while the second fund is for UNICEF, both of which will help in procuring medical supplies and help families affected by the Covid-19 outbreak. Not only the company, but many Google employees, called Googlers, have donated to the fund.

In a post, Google has announced GiveIndia will "provide cash assistance to families hit hardest by the crisis to help with their everyday expenses." The global agency, UNICEF, will utilise the funds from Google to "get urgent medical supplies, including oxygen and testing equipment, to where it's needed most in India." India is facing an acute shortage of medical supplies, including oxygen concentrators, as the Covid-19 positive cases are piling up by the hundred on a daily basis. Google CEO, Sundar Pichai, tweeted Monday saying, "Devastated to see the worsening Covid crisis in India." (Read more)
