Who: PayPal

What: Launches Cryptocurrency Checkout Service in United States

When: published on 31st March 2021

PayPal will announce later on Tuesday that it has started allowing US consumers to use their cryptocurrency holdings to pay at millions of its online merchants globally, a move that could significantly boost use of digital assets in everyday commerce.

Customers who hold Bitcoin, Ether, Bitcoin cash, and Litecoin in PayPal digital wallets will now be able to convert their holdings into fiat currencies at checkouts to make purchases, the company said.

The service, which PayPal revealed it was working on late last year, will be available at all of its 29 million merchants in the coming months, the company said.(Read more)

The World Bank and Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) have approved loan for USD 300 million (about Rs 2,190 crore) canal-based drinking water projects in Punjab.

The project is aimed at ensuring quality drinking water and minimise water losses for Amritsar and Ludhiana, according to a Punjab government statement.

The entire project will be co-financed by IBRD (World Bank) - USD 105 million, Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank - USD 105 million and the Punjab government - USD 90 million, according to an official spokesperson.(Read more)

NIIFL, through its direct private equity fund and Strategic Opportunities Fund, will get a minority stake

in Manipal Hospitals as Chairman of Manipal Education and Medical Group Ranjan Pai is selling a small

percentage of his stake in the company, reports LiveMint.(Read more)

and the management structure of the Mizoram Health department and its subsidiaries, the statement

said.

It will improve the quality and coverage of services delivered by the state government health systems,

and invest

in a comprehensive quality assurance programme which would enable quality certification of health

What: Revises Upwards Trade Growth Forecast For 2021 To 8 %

When: published on 1st April 2021



Geneva-based World Trade Organization on Wednesday revised upwards the growth forecast of global merchandise trade in 2021 to 8 per cent after recording a fall of 5.3 per cent last year, amid COVID-19

pandemic.

It said that prospects for a quick recovery in world trade have improved as merchandise trade

expanded more rapidly than expected in the second half of last year.

'According to new estimates from the WTO, the volume of world merchandise trade is expected to increase by 8 per cent in 2021 after having fallen 5.3 per cent in 2020, continuing its rebound from the pandemic-induced collapse that bottomed out in the second quarter of last year,' it said in a

statement.

It added that trade growth should then slow to 4 per cent in 2022, and the effects of the pandemic will

continue to be felt as this pace of expansion would still leave trade below its pre-pandemic

trend.(Read more)

prototype development and pilot scaling, and patenting.

The scheme is being implemented across various sectors -- from energy to healthcare to waste

management and others.

The grant is given in two phases catering to both the initial innovation stage and the advanced

enterprise setup phase through DSIR outreach-cum-cluster innovation centres available throughout

What: becomes 1st State to commission Farm Based Solar Power Project under PM-KUSUM Scheme

When: published on 1st April 2021

Rajasthan Renewable Energy Corporation Ltd on Thursday commissioned farm-based solar power

project under the PM-KUSUM scheme.

The project, established on 3.5 acres of farmland at Bhaloji village, Kotputli, in Jaipur, is the first of 623

farm-based solar projects selected by RRECL for generating 722 megawatt (MW) capacity in the state

under the first phase of the PM-KUSUM scheme, according to an official.

Energy Minister B D Kalla said Rajasthan has become the first state to commission the project which

will help the farmers earn additional income through their unused land.

He added that the state government had decided to develop the 2,600 megawatt (MW) capacity

Assembly adopted the draft resolution set forth by the Kingdom of Bahrain called 'Promoting the

UN Secretary-General António Guterres gave a message on behalf of the organisation, "Today, on the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action, we reflect on how far we have come in raising awareness of the dangers posed by landmines and recommit to our target of a mine-free world."

This year, the United Nations has pledged to highlight how "Perseverance, Partnership, and Progress" have carried the mine sector through the challenging year which saw the beginning of the pandemic. The UN will advance its efforts to mitigate the menaces of improvised explosive instruments. Landmines and explosive weapons will be cleared, exit schemes and capacity growth of national partners will persist. The mine action community will persevere to adapt and ensure to progress towards a society free from the threat of landmines and unexploded ordnance.

UN officials and other leaders will observe the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action on April 4, 2021 through ceremonies and speeches.(Read more)

Who: Nobel Laureate Isamu Akasaki

What: Passed Away At 92

When: published on 2nd April 2021

Japanese physicist Isamu Akasaki, a co-winner of the 2014 Nobel Prize in physics for inventing the

world's first efficient blue light-emitting diodes, has died, Meijo University said Friday. He was 92.

Akasaki, a professor at the university, had been recognized for the invention which has contributed to

bright and energy-saving white light sources, widely known as LED lamps.

He died of a pneumonia Thursday morning at a hospital in the central Japan city of Nagoya, the

university said.



Akasaki, born in Kagoshima Prefecture in Japan's southwest, graduated from Kyoto University in 1952 before working at Matsushita Electric Industrial Co., now Panasonic Corp. He started working at Nagoya University as a professor in 1981 and was later given an honorary title.(Read more)

Who: Russia

What: registers world's first Covid-19 vaccine for animals: Carnivac-Cov

When: published on 5th April 2021

In a first, Russia has registered the world's first coronavirus vaccine for animals, its agricultural regulator said last week. The announcement was made after tests showed that Carnivac-Cov generated antibodies against the virus in dogs, cats, foxes, and mink. The regulator, Rosselkhoznadzor said that the mass production of the vaccine for animals is likely to begin in April.

While the World Health Organisation has expressed concerns over the transmission of Covid-19 between humans and animals, the Russian regulator stressed that "the vaccine would be able to protect vulnerable species and thwart viral mutations [sic]," according to agencies. Russia till now has recorded only two cases of Covid-19 in animals, and both in cats.(Read more)

What: develops new advance technology to safeguard naval ships from missile attack

Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has developed an Advanced Chaff Technology to safeguard the naval ships against enemy missile attack, the Defence Ministry said in a statement today.

"Defence Laboratory Jodhpur (DLJ), a DRDO laboratory, has indigenously developed three variants of this critical technology namely Short Range Chaff Rocket (SRCR), Medium Range Chaff Rocket (MRCR) and Long Range Chaff Rocket (LRCR) meeting Indian Navy's qualitative requirements. The successful development of Advanced Chaff Technology by DLJ is another step towards Atmanirbhar Bharat," it further added.(Read more)

Who: Adani Ports

What: acquires remaining 25% stake in Krishnapatnam Port for Rs 2,800 crore



When: published on 5th April 2021

Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone Ltd (APSEZ) on Monday said it has acquired the remaining 25 per cent stake in Krishnapatnam Port Ltd from Vishwasamudra Holdings, making the port a wholly-

owned subsidiary of the company.

Post acquisition of the 25 per cent stake for a cash consideration of Rs 2,800 crore, APSEZ's stake in

the port will increase to 100 per cent from 75 per cent, the Adani Group company said in a release.

The acquisition is subject to approvals under applicable laws, including approval of the Competition

Commission of India, and the transaction is expected to be completed within 3 months. (Read more)

Who: Chintan Vaishnav

What: appointed as AIM mission director

When: published on 6th April 2021

Renowned socio technologist Dr. Chintan Vaishnav has been named Mission Director of Atal

Innovation Mission (AIM), NITI Aayog's flagship government initiative.

Vaishnav will replace Ramanathan Ramanan later this month. Ramanan is AIM's first mission director

since June 2017. Vaishnav currently works at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) in the

United States. He has a Ph.D. in technology, management, and politics from MIT.

Vaishnav is an engineer trained to understand and build large systems, both human and technological.

As a teacher, innovator and entrepreneur, he has first-hand experience of the innovation ecosystem in

India and the United States. Over the past decade, he has divided his time between teaching and

researching at MIT and living and working with rural communities in India, developing solutions

capable of overcoming fundamental limitations to improve human conditions. (Read more)

Who: Nguyen Xuan Phuc

What: sworn in as Vietnam's president

When: published on 5th April 2021

Nguyen Xuan Phuc, the man behind Vietnam's successful handling of the coronavirus pandemic, has

been formally sworn in as president in the Vietnamese capital, Hanoi.

Phuc, 66, was Vietnam's prime minister for the last five years, a period in which the economy boomed

and his government's COVID-19 response won plaudits at home and abroad.



Following secret voting on Monday, Phuc scored the maximum votes among the almost 500-member rubber-stamp national assembly.

Vietnam is run by the Communist Party and officially led by the party general secretary, president, and prime minister, with key decisions made by the 18-member politburo. The country is currently in the midst of its twice-a-decade leadership transition, with 76-year-old Nguyen Phu Trong re-elected in January as party general secretary, the most important of the three roles.(Read more)

Who: Kosovo's 38-year-old president

What: takes office

When: published on 6th April 2021

Kosovo's new president took office on Tuesday, becoming the country's youngest head of state and one of the youngest in the world.

Vjosa Osmani-Sadriu, 38, was elected to a five-year term on Sunday by Kosovo's Assembly, or Parliament, making her the Balkan nation's second female leader in the post-war period.

Osmani-Sadriu took office Tuesday in a ceremony with a guard of honour.

Acting President Glauk Konjufca handed over the country's constitution, avoiding a more formal ceremony due to the pandemic.

Osmani-Sadriu was formerly acting president from November until late March. (Read more)
