Explanations:

1. The error lies in Part C of the given sentence because the tense used here is present perfect tense in which the main verb should be used in its third form or participle form. But in this part, we have used the verb *seek* and it is the present indefinite form of the verb. It should have been *sought* to make the sentence grammatically correct.

The correct sentence would have been:

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has issued an advisory to the West Bengal government and **sought a report** on the rising political violence in the State.

This makes Option D the correct choice among the given options.

2. The error lies in Part B of the given sentence. Here we are talking about the report to be sent based on the ongoing strike by the doctors. We know that if a verb is to be modified, we should use an adverb to do the same and an adjective is not the suitable one to do this job. Here, we have used *urgent* and it is certainly not the correct word. It is an adjective and fails to modify the verb *send*. It should have been *urgently* in order to make the sentence grammatically correct.

The correct sentence would have been:

It is reques<mark>ted that</mark> a detailed report *be sent urgently* on the representations and ongoing strike by the doctors.

This makes Option D the correct choice among the given options.

3. There is an error in the Part B of the given sentence and the issue lies in the subject verb agreement of the given sentence. Here we are using the plural noun that they enquired about the baby and they were informed about the status of the girl. However in this part we have used the singular verb was. That is why a plural verb should have been used here.

The correct statement would have been:

As they enquired about the girl and **were informed** that she had been shifted to the hospital, they volunteered to help her.

This makes Option A the correct choice among the given options.

4. The given sentence is grammatically correct as there is no error here in the sentence.

This makes Option E the correct choice among the given options.

5. There is an error in the Part A of the given sentence where the article usage is not proper as per the grammatical norms. Here we have used *a* before the word *elite*. It is certainly not correct since it should have been *an* before a word that starts with a vowel sound.

The correct sentence would have been:

Madrid isn't getting *an elite player* in goal involvement terms, but there are two points of encouragement for the club's fans.

This makes Option C the correct choice among the given options.

6. There is an error in the Part B of the given sentence due to the fact that we are specifying a day of the week on which the meeting of the entire cabinet was held and the preposition *on* should have been placed before that day of the week, instead of *in* as used in the given sentence.

The correct sentence would have been:

At the Cabinet meeting *held on Monday*, the matter of reshuffle or expansion was not mentioned.

This makes Option B the correct choice among the given options.

7. The given sentence has no error in any part and it is grammatically correct.

This makes Option E the correct choice among the given options.

There is an error in the Part A of the given sentence due to the fact that *stand in* means *somebody is* replacing someone else on temporary basis and that is not the intended meaning in the given context. Here we imply that they want him to stand for the cause and do the needful accordingly rather than only talking about the same. The correct phrasal verb would have been *stand for* in this context.

The correct sentence would have been:

They complain that what *he stands for should have reflected* in the choice of party candidates as well in the just concluded Lok Sabha election.

This makes Option C the correct choice among the given options.



9. There is an error in the Part D of the sentence. The appropriate preposition used here with *aware* should have been *of* since the implied meaning is that somebody knows about the impact of the noise and *aware of* is the correct one to be used here. Actually, *aware off* is not even a correct phrase to be used in English.

There is no other error in any part of the sentence.

The correct sentence would be: I am aware of the fact that with regards to censorship, noise can be more powerful than silence because those who deploy this tactic are aware of the impact of this noise.


This makes Option A the correct choice among the given options.
