What: to infuse Rs 14,500 cr in banks under RBI's prompt corrective action framework soon

When: published on 13th March 2021

The finance ministry is likely to infuse Rs 14,500 crore mainly in the banks that are under the RBI's prompt corrective action framework in the next few days to improve their financial health.

Indian Overseas Bank, Central Bank of India and UCO Bank are currently under this framework that puts several restrictions on them, including on lending, management compensation and directors' fees.

The ministry has almost finalised its names of probable candidates for capital infusion, sources said.

The infusion will be made in the next few days, the sources said, adding the biggest beneficiary of this round of capital infusion would be the banks that are under the prompt corrective action (PCA).

The capital infusion will help these banks to come out of the Reserve Bank of India's enhanced regulatory supervision or PCA framework.(Read more)

India has emerged as the fifth most attractive growth destination, slipping one position after being surpassed by the United Kingdom, according to a global survey of CEOs.

The United States is the number one market that CEOs (Chief Executive Officers) are looking to in terms of growth over the next 12 months and China is at the second spot.

The findings are part of leading consultancy PwC's 24th Annual Global CEO Survey that covered 5,050 CEOs in 100 countries and territories, including India.(Read more)

What: becomes India's second biggest oil supplier, Saudi plunges to fourth spot

When: published on 15th March 2021

The United States overtook Saudi Arabia as India's second biggest oil supplier last month, as refiners boosted cheaper US crude purchases to record levels to offset Opec+ supply cuts, data from trade sources showed.

The switch in supplies, triggered by lower US crude demand, coincided with Saudi Arabia's voluntary extra 1 million bpd output cut on top of an agreement by the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries and its allies (Opec+) to maintain lower production.(Read more)

What: just agreed to build a research station on the moon together

When: published on 12th March 2021

The race to expand research opportunities on the moon is heating up. Russia and China are partnering on a project they're calling the International Lunar Research Station, or ILRS.

The China National Space Administration (CNSA) announced earlier this week that it's signed an memorandum of understanding with Russian space agency Roscosmos for the joint construction of a lunar station.

The agreement is short on details, including exactly where the station would be. The wording suggests the project could be a base on the surface of the moon, an orbital station, or a combination of the two.(Read more)

What: limited MF's investment in Debt Instruments to 10% and Banned close-ended schemes investment in perpetual bonds

When: published on 10th March 2021

SEBI, in its latest circular, has capped mutual fund investments in debt instruments with special features like that of being able to convert into equity upon trigger of a pre-specified event (for loss absorption). Additional Tier I and Tier 2 bonds fall under the above-mentioned category. Effective from 1st April, no scheme can invest more than 10 per cent of its debt assets in such bonds and not more than 5 per cent in the bonds of a single issuer. Further, the watchdog said that no AMC, under all its schemes, will invest more than 10 per cent of its debt assets in such bonds issued by a single issuer. As an important implication, the set limits will ensure that funds don't go overboard with exposures to riskier bonds in pursuit of yields.

SEBI has grandfathered the current investments by AMCs in such instruments in excess of the specified limits. But such funds cannot make any fresh investment until their investment comes below the specified limits. Further, the funds with investments in such bonds will have to ensure enablement of the side-pocketing provision in their scheme information document (SID). Now, enabling the side-pocketing provision will work towards safeguarding the interest of existing investors in case of any unfortunate event.(Read more)



Who: 1st Ever Leader-Level Summit of QUAD Countries

What: held virtually

When: published on published on 9th March 2021

The first-ever Quad--India, Japan, Australia and US leaders' summit will take place virtually on March 12, Friday, marking a significant geopolitical moment. The summit will see the participation of Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, along with Australian PM Scott Morrison, Japan's PM Yoshihide Suga and US President Joseph R Biden.

India's Ministry of External Affairs, in a statement, said, "The leaders will discuss regional and global issues of shared interest, and exchange views on practical areas of cooperation towards maintaining a free, open and inclusive Indo-Pacific region".

It explained, "The Summit will provide an opportunity to exchange views on contemporary challenges such as resilient supply chains, emerging and critical technologies, maritime security, and climate change." (Read more)

Who: New passenger train service between Dhaka and New Jalpaiguri

What: set to start from 26th March

When: published on 2nd March 2021

A new passenger train service between Dhaka and New Jalpaiguri is set to start from 26th of March marking the 50th Anniversary of the liberation of Bangladesh. According to an official release by the Bangladesh Rail Ministry, the direct train between Dhaka and New Jalpaiguri will run through the Chilahati-Haldibari cross border rail route. However, other details like the schedule of the train, fair and immigration and its name will be decided later through discussion between the officials of the two countries.

There are two passenger trains currently running between Bangladesh and India. The Maitree Express runs between Dhaka and Kolkata and Bandhan Express links Khulna with Kolkata.(Read more)

The Cyberabad Police on Saturday launched India's first-ever 'Transgender Community Desk' at the Gachibowli Police Station in Hyderabad. This desk is the first-of-its-kind gender-inclusive community policing initiatives in the country. The desk was formally inaugurated on Saturday by Cyberabad Police chief VC Sajjanar in a ceremony that was attended by over 200 transgender people.

Sajjanar said, "We get hurt for small things that happen occasionally. But the transgender community has been suffering discrimination all through their life. The help desk is a small step towards a great journey. It will herald a huge difference."
