The India Aircraft Leasing Summit 2021 was held at Vigyan Bhavan Convention Centre, New Delhi on February 26, 2021. It was held in both physical & virtual modes.

The theme of the summit was 'Rupee Raftaar'.

Who: Mumbai's undersea tunnel: From unique ventilation system

What: to earthquake resistant, key features of project

When: published on 25th February 2021

By 2023, Mumbai will be home to India's first undersea tunnel, part of the city's Rs 12,000 crore Coastal Road project.

The Coastal Road project is an under construction 22.2-kilometre freeway that would run along Mumbai's western coastline connecting Marine Lines in the south to Kandivali in the north.

Here are some key features of the tunnel:

The 2.07 kilometre tunnel, which will have two lanes, will be 10 to 70 metres deep sub-surface. These lanes will be bored between Priyadarshini Park and Chhota Chowpatty at Marine Drive.

A civic official told The Times of India that the tunnels, having a circumference of 11 metres each, would be earthquake-resistant and have a life span of more than 120 years. The tunnels will have



three lanes on each side and will get a coat of reflective paint to ensure adequate lighting. "In case of disaster, 13 cross tunnels would be opened up. Of the 13, seven cross tunnels would be for vehicles and six for human movement," said the official.(Read more)

What: holds 1st Sherpas meeting after assuming 2021 BRICS Chairship

When: published on 25th February 2021

According to the MEA release, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar launched India's BRICS 2021 website at the BRICS Secretariat at Sushma Swaraj Bhawan on February 19.

Chinese President Xi Jinping may visit India later this year, extending the support to India in hosting this year's summit. Speaking about Xi's possible attendance at the summit and whether the LAC standoff would affect both countries multilateral cooperation, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Wang Wenbin said BRICS had become an influential grouping and Beijing supported New Delhi's efforts as host.

Wenbin's statement comes a day after India and China 'positively appraised' the smooth completion of disengagement of frontline troops in the Pangong Lake area and agreed to continue their communication and push for a mutually acceptable resolution of the remaining issues along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in the Western Sector. According to the India-China Joint Statement, the two sides had a "candid and in-depth" exchange of views on other issues along the LAC in the Western Sector. (Read more)

Kumar had assumed charge as chief secretary of Bihar from May 31, 2018 following the retirement of Anjani Kumar Singh, who is currently the advisor to the chief minister(CM) Nitish Kumar.

The state government had to appoint Arun Kumar Singh after the Centre, which beached the convention by granting six month extension for successive terms, declined giving fresh extension to Deepak Kumar.(Read more)

What: Launches First Arktika-M Satellite To Monitor Arctic Region

When: published on 1st March 2021

Russia, on February 27, launched its first satellite that is aimed at monitoring the Arctic region's climate and environment. As per a statement by the country's Space Agency Roscosmos, the satellite 'Arktika-M' was launched at 9:55 am (Russian time) from Baikonur Cosmodrome, a space port leased to Russia in Kazakhstan. The satellite was carried by Soyuz-2.1b carrier rocket and entered the earth's atmosphere at 12:14 pm.

"The creation of a satellite system in highly elliptical orbits is necessary for information collection to solve operational meteorology and hydrology problems, and monitoring the climate and environment



in the Arctic region," ROSCOSMOS said while stressing on the mission's importance. However, observers and experts highlighted that Moscow was eyeing the Northern Sea Route and that the mission was a direct investment in the region. Additionally, they also warned against Russian expansion in the Arctic's energy-rich areas, which have been exposed by increasing global warming and melting ice craps.(Read more)

She has worked since 2014 as Director of UNEP's Economy Division based in Nairobi, leading UNEP's work on climate mitigation and energy transitions; on inclusive green economies, sustainable consumption and production, as well as on trade and sustainable finance, and the nexus of environment, pollution and health, the statement said. Speaking at the inauguration, Ambassador Abhay Kumar said, "Cancer is a major health problem affecting a large number of people globally. Bhabhatron is a telecobalt machine made in India for cancer treatment by the Bhabha Atomic Research Centre in Mumbai."

"During the visit of Hon'ble President of India Shri Ram Nath Kovind to Madagascar in March 2018, an announcement was made regarding the donation of Bhabhatron to Madagascar," he added.

According to an official release, Madagascar is one of the few select countries which have received the Bhabhatron-II radiotherapy machine from India.(Read more)

What: issued a joint statement to strictly observe the 2003 Ceasefire agreement along the Line of Control (LoC).

When: published on 27th February 2021

In an unexpected development, India and Pakistan militaries have agreed to "strictly" observe all agreements and adhere to ceasefire along the Line of Control from midnight of February 24 – which is the first such understanding since the 2003 ceasefire violations pact.

For the first time in recent times, India's ministry of defence and Pakistan's Inter-Services Public Relations have issued a joint statement after the talks between the director-general of military operations (DGMOs) held a discussion over their hotline.

"The two sides reviewed the situation along the Line of Control and all other sectors in a free, frank and cordial atmosphere," said the statement.

Further, the statement noted that the two DGMOs "agreed to address each other's core issues and concerns which have propensity to disturb peace and lead to violence" in the interest of "achieving mutually beneficial and sustainable peace along the borders".(Read more)
