What: dies of Covid at 69

Former Union minister Dilip Gandhi, who is also a former MP from Ahmednagar, died of Covid-19 at a private hospital in New Delhi early on Wednesday. He was 69. He is survived by his wife, two sons and a daughter.

Gandhi was in Delhi for some personal work. On Tuesday, he had tested positive for Covid-19 and was admitted to a private hospital, where he was put on ventilator support. He died at 3 am on Wednesday, said BJP leaders.

Gandhi had represented the Ahmednagar seat in Lok Sabha for three consecutive terms. He was first elected in 1999. He served as minister for state in the Union Shipping Ministry in the Atal Bihari Vajpayee-led government. (Read more)

What: becomes first Indian paddler to qualify for Tokyo Olympics

The seasoned Achanta Sharath Kamal on Thursday became the first Indian paddler to qualify for the Tokyo Olympic Games after a dominant win over Pakistan's Muhammad Rameez at the Asian Olympic Qualification tournament in Doha.

The veteran Indian thrashed Rameez 11-4, 11-1, 11-5, 11-4 in little over 22 minutes in the second men's singles round-robin match in the South Asia group.

Kamal had lost his opening match 9-11, 13-15, 11-5, 11-7, 12-10, 9-11, 8-11 to compatriot Gnansekaran Sathiyan.

The win over Rameez ensured at least a second-place finish for Kamal and it was enough to secure a spot in the delayed Games, scheduled to begin in July. (Read more)

Indian Naval Landing Craft Utility (LCU) L58, the eighth and last ship of the Landing Craft Utility (LCU) Mark IV Class, was commissioned into the Indian Navy at Port Blair, Andaman & Nicobar Islands on Thursday.

Commander-in-Chief, Andaman and Nicobar Command (CINCAN) Lieutenant General Manoj Pande was the Chief Guest and Chairman and Managing Director, Garden Reach Shipbuilders & Engineers Ltd (GRSE) Rear Admiral Vipin Kumar Saxena, IN (Retd) was present for the event.

According to a press statement from the Ministry of Defence, Commander Krishan K Yadav read the Commissioning Warrant as the first Commanding Officer of the ship. The ship is manned by a motivated team of five officers and 50 sailors. Indigenously designed and built by GRSE, Kolkata, the ship's commissioning has added one more feather in the cap of the nation's 'Make in India' & 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' programme in the field of warship design and construction. What: expects India's GDP to be Contracted 6.9% in 2020 and Grow 5% in 2021

When: published on 19th March 2021

The United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) on Thursday said India's Covid-19 stimulus fell short of initial announcements, leading to a lower than expected economic performance in 2020.

In its Trade and Development 2020 update, it said the relief measures adopted by India were not only much smaller in scale, but also centred on easing supply side constraints and providing liquidity support rather than aggregate demand support. UNCTAD expects India's GDP to have contracted 6.9% in 2020 and grow 5% in 2021, attributing the stronger recovery projected for 2021 to the deeper-than-expected downturn in 2020.

"Moreover, restrictions to people's movement not only severely affected incomes and consumption, they also proved largely unsuccessful in containing the spread of the virus," the UN agency said in its report titled 'Out of the frying pan... into the fire'. (Read more)

What: is at 8th position in 'Market-cap' Among World's Top 10 Nations: Bloomberg

When: published on 17th March 2021

Indian stocks gained most among the world's top 10 countries by market value this financial year, as per Bloomberg data. India's aggregate market capitalisation rose 88% in dollar terms while aggregate market capitalisation of the US and China rose 67% and 52% respectively, from April 2020 so far. However, India remained at the eighth position with \$2.8 trillion market capitalisation. (Read more)

What: is Building World's Largest Floating Solar Farms

When: published on 14th March 2021

It may be one of the world's smallest countries, but the island-state of Singapore has a big emissions problem.

In fact the nation is one of the biggest carbon dioxide emitters per capita, and the densely populated nature of the city makes it hard to find the necessary space for green initiatives.

So Singapore has turned to the water to house the solar panels needed to generate more renewable energy. Among the plans is the biggest solar farm in Southeast Asia, covering an area the size of 45 football pitches with more than 122,000 solar panels. (Read more)

What: has world's most dangerous roads; India in fourth place: Study

When: published on 19th March 2021

South Africa has been ranked as the world's most dangerous country to drive in while India came in at fourth place, according to a research study undertaken by international driver education company Zutobi.

Among the list of 56 countries in the study, Thailand came in second position and the US took up third spot.

The safest roads in the world can be found in Norway, with its Scandinavian neighbour Sweden having the third safest roads while Japan took second place, according to the study. (Read more)

The Disha initiative, a five-year collaboration between UNDP and the IKEA Foundation, enabled one million women through skilling and counselling services to access job and livelihood opportunities across five states -- Delhi NCR, Haryana, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Telangana. (Read more)

This program will introduce the fundamentals of cloud computingsuch as cloud storage, virtual compute power, web hosting, artificial intelligence (AI), machine learning (ML), and virtual reality (VR), to students at more than 7000 Atal Tinkering Labs (ATLs) in India. AWS will also conduct Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) for the personnel in-charge at the ATLs, and provide resources and tools ateach ATL to expedite student learning, and enable them to create and build solutions on the cloud.
