Who: Haryana

What: wins 11th Hockey India sub-junior women National Championship

When: published on 19th March 2021

Haryana defeated Jharkhand 4-3 in a shootout to clinch the 11th Hockey India sub-junior women National Championship 2021 title after the final ended 0-0 on Thursday.

The first half ended goalless in a closely contested final between two high-scoring sides. The deadlock continued in the second half with neither Haryana nor Jharkhand coming close to scoring.

Then, Haryana Captain Nidhi starred in the shootout, denying Edlin Bage and Sweety Dungdung, and Nisha Minj's attempts on goal. (Read more)

Who: Rating agency Moody's projects India's GDP

What: to grow by 12 % this year

When: published on 19th March 2021

American business and financial services company Moody's Analytics has projected India's GDP to grow by 12% in 2021. In an earlier estimate last November, it had said India's GDP will grow at 9% in the calendar year.

In an updated projection released yesterday it said India's near-term prospects have turned more favourable following a stronger than expected December quarter, when GDP grew by 0.4% over the year following a 7.5% contraction in the September quarter. Domestic and external demand has been on the mend since the easing of restrictions, which has led to improved manufacturing output in recent months.

Battered by the coronavirus pandemic, Indian economy is officially projected to contract 8% in FY21, in its worst show in more than four decades. However, most professional forecasters have

projected double-digit growth for India in FY22, considered mostly a statistical rebound than a V-shaped recovery. (Read more)

India has secured the 139th spot out of 149 countries in the UN World Happiness Report 2021. India ranked 140th in 2019 and 144th in 2020.

"Our aim was twofold, first to focus on the effects of COVID-19 on the structure and quality of people's lives, and second to describe and evaluate how governments all over the world have dealt with the pandemic. Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Wednesday launched the wesbiste of radio programme "Awaam Ki Baat", aimed at seeking public feedback to make the process of governance interactive, participative and people-centric, an official spokesperson said.

Sinha said the 30-minute "Awaam Ki Baat" programme, starting from April and to be aired every third Sunday of the month, is a leap towards strengthening the concept of Jan Bhagidari by inviting people's participation.

Who: Gram Ujala scheme

What: to offer LED bulbs for Rs 10 per piece in rural areas

When: published on 20th March 2021

State-run EESL arm Convergence Energy Services Ltd (CESL) on Friday launched the Gram Ujala programme under which high quality energy efficient LED bulbs will be given for Rs 10 per piece in certain villages of five states in the first phase.

In the first phase of this programme, 15 million LED bulbs will be distributed across villages of Aarah (Bihar), Varanasi (Uttar Pradesh), Vijaywada (Andhra Pradesh), Nagpur (Maharashtra), and villages in western Gujarat. The programme will be financed entirely through carbon credits and will be the first such programme in India.

"CESL, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Energy Efficiency Services Ltd (EESL), unveiled GRAM UJALA programme today," CESL said in a statement. (Read more)

7. Hints to remember

Who: Dwarka Expressway, India's first elevated Urban Expressway,

What: to be completed before Independence Day next year

When: published on 6th March 2021

Union minister Nitin Gadkari said on Friday that he is hopeful that the construction work on Rs 8,662-crore Dwarka Expressway will be completed before 15 August 2022. The 29-km expressway, which connects Dwarka in Delhi to Gurugram, is being constructed under the Bharatmala Project. Gadkari said it will be the first-ever elevated Urban Expressway in India.

The construction of this Expressway will also immensely help to reduce air pollution in the Delhi-NCR region. On Thursday, Gadkari made an inspectional visit to Dwarka Expressway. "He reviewed the



progress of India's First Grade Separated Urban Expressway, Dwarka Expressway," an official statement said. Note that the Expressway is being built in four packages and the total length of it is 29 kilometres out of which 18.9-kilometre length falls in Haryana while the remaining 10.1-kilometre length is in Delhi. Who: "Battle Ready For 21st Century"

What: Released At Centre For Land Warfare Studies (CLAWS)

When: published on 17th March 2021

"Battle Ready for 21st Century" co-edited by Lt Gen AK Singh, Distinguished Fellow CLAWS and Brig Narender Kumar, Visiting Fellow CLAWS was released by Gen Bipin Rawat, CDS and Gen Deepak Kapoor, Former Chief of the Army Staff at Centre for Land Warfare Studies (CLAWS).

The book has endeavoured to postulate and define emerging areas of conflict, desired capabilities and doctrinal issues that need careful examination. The authors with hands-on experience and domain specialisation have endeavoured to define and suggest the ways and means necessary to secure India from emerging security challenges on land, air, sea, space, cyber domain and even cognitive domain. The book is dwelling on future conflicts that India may face and need to build capabilities to dissuade and prevent accidental wars. The foreword is written by former Naval Chief Admiral Arun Prakash. Former Chief of the Army Staff Gen NC Vij and Prof Gautam Sen have commented on the book for empirically identifying future security challenges and the need for building capabilities. (Read more)

Who: Audio cassette tape inventor Lou Ottens

What: dies aged 94

When: published on 10th March 2021

Lou Ottens, the Dutch engineer credited with inventing the audio cassette tape, has died aged 94.

An estimated 100 billion cassette tapes have been sold around the world since they were introduced in the 1960s.

Ottens' invention transformed the way people listened to music, and there has even been a resurgence of the cassette in recent years.

The engineer died in his hometown of Duizel last weekend, his family announced on Tuesday.

Ottens became head of Philips' product development department in 1960, where he and his team developed the cassette tape. (Read more)

What: Commissions 15,000-tonne Ocean Surveillance Ship INS Dhruv Amid Face Off With China

When: published on 17th March 2021

In an attempt to pushback the Chinese Navy's rapidly-expanding People's Liberation Army Navy (PLAN), the Indian Navy is all set to commission INS Druv (codenamed VC 1118) ship, which is capable of tracking nuclear missiles and satellites from a distance. This ocean surveillance ship is also equipped with game changer active electronically scanned array (AESA) radars that can help India collect accurate data, not just about an enemy nation's missile range and capabilities, but will also track India's own strategic missiles that are in the trial stage.

According to sources aware of the development, the sophisticated surveillance system needs 14MW power to fire up and this power will be generated by INS Dhruv itself. This highly classified project is currently being given the final touches in Vizag before the commissioning. The sources further informed that that INS Dhruv has gone through a series of tests and sea trials starting 2018 and now after being delayed by months due to the pandemic, it is now ready to be commissioned. A wholly-owned subsidiary of the bank namely PNB Cards & Services Ltd has been incorporated on March 16, 2021, by the Registrar of Companies, Delhi, it said in a regulatory filing. The subsidiary will undertake the non-financial support services related to credit card business of the bank.

The authorised capital of the company is Rs 25 crore and the paid-up capital is Rs 15 crore, PNB said.

The number of outstanding credit cards at the end of December 2020 of PNB stood at over 4.3 crore (43,402,879), according to the RBI data. (Read more)

What: slips to 56th position in home price appreciation: Knight Frank

India has moved down 13 spots in the latest global home price index, finishing last at 56th rank in the quarter ended December 2020, according to property consultancy Knight Frank's Global House Price Index.

India, which was at the 43rd rank in Q4 2019, saw a decline of 3.6% year-on-year (YoY) in home prices, leading to the drop in global position, the report showed. (Read more)

What: passes away at 81

Bangladesh erstwhile prime minister Barrister Moudud Ahmed died on Tuesday in Singapore. He was 81.

Barrister Abdullah Al Mahmoud, a junior lawyer in Barrister Moudud Ahmed's chambers, confirmed it on Tuesday evening.

Moudud, who was member of the BNP's standing committee, breathed his last at Mount Elizabeth Hospital in Singapore, where he was undergoing treatment since February 1.

Last year, Moudud was admitted to the Apollo Hospital Dhaka after suffering a heart attack. He also complained of chest pain and respiratory problems. Earlier, the BNP leader was admitted to various hospitals in the capital for the treatment of some illness.

Barrister Moudud Ahmed was born on 24 May 1940 in Kompaniganj Upazila of Noakhali district in the Bengal Presidency of British India (now Bangladesh). (Read more)

September 2019, after a brief stint as an officer on special duty (OSD).

Sinha was made OSD to the prime minister in August 2019, after he had served four years as cabinet

secretary.

The Print reported, citing sources, that there is a possibility that Sinha could be considered by the Modi government for a constitutional post, such as lieutenant governor of Delhi or Puducherry. It

added that he resigned citing "personal reasons". (Read more)
