Sarhadi began his career writing Urdu short stories and entered Bollywood via Yash Chopra's 1976 "Kabhi Kabhie", starring Amitabh Bachchan and Raakhee.

The writer collaborated with Chopra to pen the screenplay in acclaimed films like "Silsila" and Sridevi and Rishi Kapoor starrer "Chandni", for which he wrote the dialogues. (Read more)

What: wins All England Badminton C'ships Men's title; Nozomi Okuhara clinches Women's title

Malaysia's Lee Zii Jia has won the All England Badminton Championships men's title as he defeated Denmark's Viktor Axelsen in the summit clash.

The 22-year-old defeated Axelsen 30-29, 20-22, 21-9 in the summit clash which lasted for one hour and 14 minutes. With this win, Malaysia's title drought came to an end and it is after four years, that someone from the country has managed to win the All England Open. Lee Chong Wei had last won the All England Open for Malaysia in 2017. Japan's Nozomi Okuhara won the women's title as she defeated Pornpawee Chochuwong 21-12, 21-16 in the finals. (Read more)

India's Singhraj won gold in the P1 men's 10m air pistol SH1 category at the World Shooting Para Sport World Cup in Al Ain, UAE.

Singhraj, a Sydney 2019 World Championships medallist, pipped the 2016 Rio Paralympics bronze medallist Server Ibragimov by 2.8 points. The final score read 236.8 to 234.



After the penultimate series, Ibragimov was leading by 0.1 of a point. In the final series, the Indian shot a 9.9 and 10.4, while the Uzbekistan shooter managed 9.5 and 7.9 to settle for the silver. (Read more)

What: Has World's Fourth Strongest Military, USA Comes at Second Place: Report

When: published on 21st March 2021

China has the strongest military force in the world while India stands at number four, according to a study released on Sunday by defence website Military Direct. "The USA, despite their enormous military budgets, comes in 2nd place with 74 points, followed by Russia with 69, India at 61 and then France with 58. The UK just about makes the Top 10, coming in 9th place with a score of 43," said the study.

The study said "ultimate military strength index" was calculated after taking into consideration various factors including budgets, number of inactive and active military personnel, total air, sea, land and nuclear resources, average salaries, and weight of equipment. China has the strongest military in the world, scoring 82 out of 100 points in the index, it noted. (Read more)

What: Launches 'Education Mentoring Programme' for Girls of Class 9-12

Over 200 students from Indira Gandhi Delhi Technological University for Women will mentor 1,000 girl students of Delhi government schools in grades 9 to 12 under the AAP dispensation's "Education Mentoring Programme" launched on Saturday. The Delhi Government launched the programme through its "Youth for Education" initiative, which focuses on mentoring girls studying in grades 9 to 12.

According to Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia, BTech, MTech, PhD, and MBA students of the university will mentor these students. Initially, 200 students will mentor 1,000 students, he said.

"Our world is becoming a knowledge economy, with dedicated research and innovation quickly becoming key to progress. Although our nation is seeing some major innovations in every field of work, these innovations are mostly led by men. The participation of women is abysmal when it comes to innovation, especially in the field of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM)," he said. (Read more)

What: launches 'SAAMAR' campaign to fight malnutrition

When: published on 22nd March 2021

In Jharkhand, a 1000-day campaign will run through the summer project as part of the counterinsurgency initiative on malnutrition. According to the latest National Nutrition Survey, 42.9 percent of Jharkhand are malnourished children. It will have a digital survey.



Recently, the Government of Jharkhand has launched "SAAMAR Abhiyan" to combat malnutrition in the state. SAAMAR's Full From: "Strategic Action for Alleviation of Malnutrition and Anaemia Reduction".

This campaign has been launched with a target of 1000 days, where there will be an annual survey to monitor the progress of the campaign. Under this campaign, in states where malnutrition has become a major problem, anemic women and malnourished children will be identified by bringing different departments together to effectively deal with the problem.

The Economic Survey 2021 states that a comprehensive National Nutrition Survey was conducted in Jharkhand for the period March 2017 to July 2017. According to this survey, 45% of children are underweight.

The team formed for this campaign will go door-to-door in their area to get information related to malnutrition among children under five years of age. Health information will be obtained of adolescent girls, women, and lactating mothers in the age group of 15 to 35 years suffering from anemia.

In case of symptoms of anemia and malnutrition in anyone, they will be closely examined at the nearest Anganwadi center for examination. Severely malnourished children will be sent to the nearest health center for necessary treatment.

The 2011 Istanbul Convention, signed by 45 countries and the European Union, requires governments to adopt legislation prosecuting domestic violence and similar abuse as well as marital rape and female genital mutilation. (Read more)

Every year on March 20, World Sparrow Day is celebrated all over the globe with an aim to raise awareness and protect the bird. Who: Kamalpreet Kaur

What: lights up final day with record-breaking discus throw

When: published on 20th March 2021

On the final day of the Federation Cup, all eyes were on the women's discus throw with Seema Punia competing in India after over two years. The 37-year-old 2014 Asian Games gold medallist was the favourite on Friday until Punjab's Kamalpreet Kaur turned the tables with her first and only legal throw.

The 25-year-old took everyone by surprise, hurling the discus 65.06m, comfortably breaching the Olympic qualification mark of 63.50m and shattering the previous national record of 64.76 set by Krishna Poonia in 2012.

Seema finished second (62.64m) ahead of Delhi's Sonal Goyal (51.11m). Kamalpreet, a clerk with the Indian Railways, could not control her excitement. She hadn't slept properly for the last three nights due to the adrenaline rush. (Read more)

Who: Acclaimed Egyptian feminist Nawal Saadawi

What: dies at age 89

When: published on 21st March 2021

Nawal Saadawi, a renowned Egyptian feminist, psychiatrist and novelist, whose writings have stirred controversy for decades in an overwhelming conservative society, died of age-related health problems in Cairo on Sunday, officials said. She was 89.

Egypt's Culture Minister Inas Abdel-Dayem mourned Saadawi's passing, saying her writings had created a great intellectual movement.

Born in October 1931 in a Nile Delta village, Saadawi studied medicine in Cairo University. She worked as a psychiatrist and university lecturer and authored dozens of books. She was also a regular writer in Egyptian newspapers. (Read more)

Who: International Nowruz Day

What: was observed on March 21

The International Day of Nowruz occurs on 21st March, the first day of spring in the northern hemisphere. Nowruz celebrations include a variety of rituals, ceremonies, traditional games, special dishes, performances and other cultural events which take place during a period of around two weeks. Nowruz was originally inscribed on the Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity in 2009 by 6 countries and later in 2016 was extended to another 6. The countries who have jointly inscribed Nowruz are : Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, India, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Iraq, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan, Pakistan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Turkey.

Many of the gatherings, celebrations, ceremonies, and performances which are so central to the celebration of Nowruz could not take place in person this year due to the pandemic. This has greatly affected the ability of many communities to practice and enjoy their living heritage as they would usually do. Still, despite the restrictions, communities have found new ways to come together and celebrate Nowruz. While traditional gatherings around 'the Table' may be seriously restricted, many communities have taken to digital technologies to celebrate. In times of crisis, such traditions and festive events serve to bring people together, underscoring our need for social connection in turbulent times and contributing to community solidarity and togetherness.
