What: slips 13 places to 56th position in global home price index

When: published on 22nd March 2021

In the latest global home price index, India has slipped 13 spots, to rank 56th globally, when it comes to home price appreciation. International property consultancy, Knight Frank, in its 'Global House Price Index Q4 2020', cited that India has seen a decline of 3.6% year-on-year (YoY), which led to the slip. Note that for the purposes of research, the consultancy tracks the prices of homes in 56 countries. India, in Q4 2020, therefore, remains the weakest contender among nations. (Read more)

What: launches Sankalp campaign on covid appropriate behavior

When: published on 23rd March 2021

Madhya Pradesh is launching a state wide Sankalp or resolution campaign from today for a week to create awareness on covid appropriate behaviour. State continues to register high covid positivity rate. AIR Bhopal Correspondent reports that sirens will be played at 11 am and 7 pm in the state. The public will stop at their place and take a 2-minute resolution for the use of masks and maintaining social distancing.

Meanwhile, Madhya Pradesh on Monday recorded 1,342 covid positive cases while 754 patients recovered from infection. Indore and Bhopal continues to report highest number of covid cases. The active caseload in both two cities is more than 2,000. Out of the total cases of covid in the state, about half of the cases are from these two cities. Indore is reporting 27 percent of the total covid cases in the state while share of Bhopal is 25 percent. (Read more)

What: start fresh fruit cake 'movement' to sustain during pandemic

Fruit growers in rural Maharashtra have started an innovative 'movement' to promote fresh fruit cakes as a healthier option, instead of the traditional bakery-made cakes, to celebrate birthdays and other special occasions.



According to farmers and agrarian experts, the aim of this 'spontaneous' movement, which is gaining popularity on social media, is to encourage farmers and their families to increase the intake of fruits in their diet and to find a new way of selling their produce in the times of COVID-19.

As part of the movement, farmers, their families and various organisations of cultivators are encouraging cakes made locally using fruits like watermelon, muskmelon, grapes, orange, pineapple and banana while celebrating special events. (Read more)

March 25 is the International Day of Solidarity with Detained and Missing Staff Members. This date is the anniversary of the abduction of Alec Collett, a journalist who died while working for the UN.

The UN promotes the International Day of Solidarity with Detained and Missing Staff Members to encourage governments to do more in their power to protect UN personnel in their jobs.

The day is also a moment to remember UN personnel who have been abducted whilst doing their job, such as journalist Alec Collett. Collett worked for the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East when he was abducted by armed gunman in on March 25, 1985. His body was found in Lebanon's Bekaa Valley in 2009 and eventually returned to his family. (Read more)

What: was observed on 25th March

The United Nations' (UN) International Day of Remembrance of the Victims of Slavery and the Transatlantic Slave Trade is on March 25 each year. It honors the lives of those who died as a result of slavery or experienced the horrors of the transatlantic slave trade. It is also an occasion to raise awareness about the dangers of racism and prejudice.

Various events are held on the International Day of Remembrance of the Victims of Slavery and the Transatlantic Slave Trade. These include memorial services and vigils for those who died in slavery, as a result of the slave trade, or from campaigning to end of slavery. What: launches Climate Data Service Portal with data of over 100 years

When: published on 23rd March 2021

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Tuesday launched a Climate Data Service Portal with data of over 100 years which can be accessed by the public. The Climate Data Services Portal has been developed by IMD, Pune with user-friendly platforms for climate data management and supply to the users. It complements fully automated climate data management processes from real-time data acquisition to expeditious data dissemination.

The IMD has meteorological data since 1900. The major components of the portal are real-time monitoring of weather observations recorded by IMD observatories, encapsulated IMD Metadata Portal, other reports and dashboards, online access to meteorological data through data supply portal. Who: North Korea

What: fires 2 Ballistic Missiles in Sea

When: published on 25th March 2021

North Korea launched at least two projectiles suspected by Japan to be ballistic missiles on Thursday, officials in Seoul, Tokyo and Washington said, the first such test reported since US President Joe Biden took office in January.

North Korea's ballistic missiles are banned under United Nations Security Council Resolutions, and if the launch is confirmed it would represent a new challenge to Biden's efforts to engage with Pyongyang, which have so far been rebuffed. (Read more)

What: commissioned to the Indian Coast Guard

When: published on 24th March 2021

L&T-built Offshore Patrol Vessel (OPV) ICGS Vajra was commissioned into the Indian Coast Guard (ICG) by General Bipin Rawat, Chief of Defence Staff, at Chennai in the presence of Director General K Natarajan, Director General, ICG; JD Patil, Whole Time Director (Defence & Smart Technologies) and Member of the L&T Board.

ICGS Vajra is the sixth vessel in the series of seven OPVs being built by L&T under a Ministry of Defence contract signed in the year 2015. Like the five OPVs in the series, ICGS Vajra was also delivered ahead of the contractual schedule. The seventh OPV ICGS Vigraha, was launched in Oct 2020 and is being readied for sea trials, says a company press release. (Read more)

What: to acquire SkyPower Global's 50 MW Solar Asset in Telangana

When: published on 20th March 2021

Adani Green Energy Limited (AGEL) on Saturday announced that it has signed a share purchase agreement for acquisition of 100 per cent stake in an SPV holding 50 MW operating solar project of the Toronto-headquartered SkyPower Global.

The project is located in Telangana and was commissioned in October 2017 and has a long-term Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with the Southern Power Distribution Company in the state.

With this acquisition, AGEL shall increase its operating renewable capacity of 3,395 MW with a total renewable portfolio of 14,865 MW. The closing of the transaction is subject to customary approvals and conditions. (Read more)

What: to sell 15% stake in Rail Vikas Nigam via OFS

When: published on 23rd March 2021

The government on Tuesday said it will dilute 15 per cent stake in Rail Vikas Nigam Ltd via an offer for sale to raise nearly Rs 750 crore.



The issue will open on Wednesday for non-retail investors, and on Thursday for retail investors.

"Offer for Sale in RVNL opens tomorrow for Non Retail investors. Retail investors can bid on Thursday. Govt. would divest 10% equity with a 5% Green Shoe option," Department of Investment and Public Asset Management (DIPAM) Secretary Tuhin Kanta Pandey said in a tweet. (Read more)

Who: NSE

What: becomes co-promoter in IGX, buys 26% stake in gas trading hub

When: published on 11th March 2021

The Indian Energy Exchange (IEX) has divested 26 per cent of its equity holding in the Indian Gas Exchange (IGX) to National Stock Exchange of India (NSE).

The transaction was through NSE's wholly owned subsidiary NSE Investments. According to officials, NSE became a co-promoter and the second largest shareholder on the IGX gas-trading platform with the stake buy.

IEX, an electricity trading platform, said that it separately shed a 5 per cent equity holding to Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC).

IEX, which set up the IGX natural gas trading hub, had earlier sold 5 per cent stake each to GAIL (India), Adani Total Gas, and Torrent Gas. After the latest sale, IEX now has 54 per cent share holding remaining in IGX. This makes NSE and IEX the two promoters and the rest equity shareholders in the platform. (Read more)

Who: Denis Sassou Nguesso, President of Republic of Congo

What: Re-elected with 88% vote

When: published on published on 23rd March 2021

Denis Sassou Nguesso has been re-elected president of the Republic of the Congo with 88.57 percent of the vote, according to provisional results.

The 77-year-old has been in power for an accumulated 36 years, first taking the helm in 1979 and then again in 1997 after losing the country's first multiparty elections in 1992.

His victory, announced on Tuesday by the interior minister citing figures from the electoral commission, was widely expected after a March 20 ballot boycotted by the main opposition.



The Pan-African Union for Social Democracy (UPADS) said in January it would not to field a candidate in Sunday's vote, arguing the conditions were not conducive for holding elections and that it would only lead to more divisions in the country. (Read more)
