"Quarantine was the only word to rank in the top five for both search spikes and overall views (more than 183,000 by early November), with the largest spike in searches (28,545) seen in the week of March 18-24, when many countries around the world went into lockdown as a result of Covid-19," as per an official release. The funding has gone to the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and UN Women that have been asked to channel at least 30 per cent of it to organisations run by women that prevent violence against women and girls, and help victims and survivors with access to medical care, family planning, legal advice, safe spaces, mental health services and counselling, UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs said in a press release on Wednesday. The company name is subject to approval of the Registrar of Companies, Mumbai, they added.

All these banks have acquired 6. 67 per cent stake each (representing 50,000 equity shares) in IBBIC for a cash consideration of Rs 5 lakh. (Read more)

Who: 23 Medicinal Plants Of Karnataka

What: On IUCN's Endangered List

When: published on 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2020

Around 23 rare medicinal plants in various forests of Karnataka are on the verge of extinction and listed as 'endangered' on the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) list.

The Karnataka Biodiversity Board and National Medicinal Plants Board (NMPB) conducted study has revealed that medicinal plants like sandalwood, wild clove, red sanders, wild Jamun, wild cinnamon



and other species endemic to the Western Ghats have turned endangered on the IUCN list, reported Deccan Herald.

The study spanning for five years by forest officials, botanists and field experts helped document more than 4,800 flowering plant species in various circles of the forests. Out of these, 60 rare species are medicinally prominent, including the 23 endangered species. (Read more)

What: Unveils Sahakar Pragya Initiative Launched By NCDC

Union minister for agriculture and farmers welfare Narendra Singh Tomar on Tuesday unveiled the Sahakar Pragya initiative launched by the National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC). As part of the initiative, 18 regional training centres and 45 training modules for primary cooperatives were launched.

The NCDC will run these training centres across the country, along with the Laxmanrao Inamdar National Academy for Cooperative Research and Development (LINAC).

The training modules aim to impart knowledge and organisational skills and attempt to prepare the primary cooperative societies across the country to be able to play a big role in the government's AtmaNirbhar Bharat initiative.

Speaking at the event, Tomar lauded NCDC's efforts and advised officials to empower farmers in primary cooperative societies through dedicated and innovative training programmes.

Ever since being set up in 1985, LINAC, has trained more than 30,000 people from cooperative societies. NCDC managing director Sundeep K Nayak said LINAC has chalked out a plan to train about 5,000 farmers in cooperative societies in a year's time. The 45 dedicated training modules would equip the cooperative societies to run their affairs in professional business terms of market economy, Nayak added. (Read more)

What: extends ABVKY scheme up to June 2021

When: published on 24<sup>th</sup> November 2020

ESI Corporation (ESIC) has announced the extension of the "Atal Beemit Vyakti Kalyan Yojana" (ABVKY) by another one year up to June 30, 2021and relaxed the eligibility conditions for the period between March 24, 2020 and December 31, 2020.

The Corporation had earlier introduced (on a pilot basis) a new cash benefit under ABVKY – effective from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2020, to provide cash compensation to insured persons rendered jobless. This has been extended up to end-June next year.

Highlighting the relaxed (eligibility) conditions, the corporation in a notification said that the insured person should have been in employment for a minimum of two years before his/ her unemployment, and should have contributed for not less than 78 days in the contribution period immediately preceding to unemployment and minimum of 78 days in one of the three contribution periods in two years before losing the job. It has enhanced the unemployment relief up to 50 per cent of the average per day earning during the previous four contribution periods subject to a maximum 90 days of unemployment, the claim is payable for the full month of unemployment. The claim can be made 30 days from the date of losing the job.

The insured person can scan and upload the documents (AB1 Claim Form, Aadhaar, bank account details etc. ) online or submit a hard copy duly signed at the concerned ESIC branch office.

The original eligibility conditions of the ABVKY scheme would, however, hold good for those rendered unemployed on or before March 23, 2020 and on or after January 1, 2021.

What: dies at 82

All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB) vice-president and prominent Shia cleric Maulana Kalbe Sadiq died on Tuesday. He was 82.

In a statement, the state government said Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath expressed condolences to Sadiq's family. "He wished that his soul rests in peace and expressed condolences to the grieving family," it said.

The cleric's son, Kalbe Sibtain Noori, told The Indian Express that Sadiq breathed his last in ERA's Lucknow Medical College & Hospital, where he was admitted on November 16. He was being treated in the hospital ICU for severe pneumonia, urinary tract infection, and septic shock. He was on assisted ventilation and vasopressor support. (Read more)

The Indian national team have moved up a spot to 104 in the latest FIFA Rankings, released on Friday.



Igor Stimac's men were ranked 108th in the October 2020 rankings. In two months, India have climbed 5 spots after being 109th in September. India have had no international action for almost a year now.

The Blue Tigers were to host Qatar in March 2020 before embarking on trips to Bangladesh and Afghanistan as part of their 2022 FIFA World Cup and 2023 AFC Asian Cup joint qualification matches from Group E. However, amid the Coronavirus pandemic the fixtures, after initially being postponed to October, now are set to take place in March and June 2021. (Read more)

What: gets largest solar project at Leh Indian Air Force station

When: published on 26<sup>th</sup> November 2020

The Union Territory of Ladakh has got the largest solar power project setup under the Centre's 'Make In India' initiative at Leh IAF station to provide sustainable energy alternative to fossil fuel and traditional methods of energy generation. The project namely 'Provision of Solar Photo Voltaic Powerplant 1. 5 MW' has been completed within 12 months well before the completion deadline of March 31, 2021, a defence spokesman said.

"The largest solar project at a high altitude in the entire Leh in the Union Territory of Ladakh has been established at IAF Station Leh," he said.

The spokesman said the project was conceptualised under Make In India, and executed to provide sustainable energy alternative to fossil fuel and traditional methods.

It is the largest installed solar project till date out of the target of 300 MW in three phases for defence sectors and 14 MW for Leh region as set by the Union Ministry of New and Renewable Energy. (Read more)

Who: TCS founder Faqir Chand Kohli

What: passes away at 96

When: published on 26<sup>th</sup> November 2020

Father of Indian software industry and the first CEO of Tata Consultancy Services, Faqir Chand Kohli, passed away on Thursday. He was 96 years old, TCS confirmed.

In 2002 Kohli was awarded the Padma Bhushan for his contribution to the Indian software industry. He was the pioneer of the country's 'Technology Revolution' and helped India country build its \$100 billion IT industry.



Born on March 19, 1924 in Peshwar, he did his BA and B. SC from the Government College for Men in Lahore under Punjab University. Later he went to Queen's University in Canada and completed B. Sc (Hons) in Electrical Engineering in 1948. He also did his MS in Mechanical engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1950.

Kohli returned to India in 1951 and joined Tata Electric Companies and rose to become its Director in 1970. During this tenure he was responsible for the use of digital computers for power system design and control. (Read more)

#### What: passes away

When: published on 26<sup>th</sup> November 2020

James Wolfensohn, an investment banker who helped straighten out the finances of major American cultural institutions and served as president of the World Bank, died Wednesday at the age of 86.

World Bank Group President David Malpas paid tribute, saying that Wolfensohn "sharpened its focus on poverty reduction and redoubled its efforts to combat corruption, give voice to the poor, and magnify the impact of development investments."

"Jim transformed the World Bank Group, increasing decentralization, advancing the Bank technologically, and making the organization more open and transparent," Malpas said.

IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva hailed Wolfensohn's "lifelong commitment. . . to fight poverty with passion and professionalism. "(Read more)

Who: Lt Gen Harpal Singh

What: appointed new Engineer-in-Chief of Indian Army

When: published on 25<sup>th</sup> November 2020

Lt Gen Harpal Singh has been appointed as the new Engineer-in-Chief of the Indian Army. He is presently the Director-General of Border Roads Organisation and would take over his new appointment on December 1.

Lt Gen Harpal Singh, an alumnus of National Defence Academy, Khadakwasla, was commissioned into the Corps of Engineers on 24 December 1982.

He later commanded a Border Roads Task Force in Jammu and Kashmir valley. He has also been the Chief Engineer of Project Dantak (BRO) at Bhutan, Chief Engineer (Navy), Mumbai and Chief Engineer HQ Eastern Command.



Lt Gen Harpal Singh is a graduate of the Defence Services Staff College, Wellington, the Higher Command and National Defence College courses. (Read more)

What: test-launches Tsirkon hypersonic missile in the Arctic

When: published on 27<sup>th</sup> November 2020

Russia successfully test-fired a Tsirkon hypersonic cruise missile in the Arctic, the country's Defence Ministry has announced.

On Thursday, the frigate Admiral Gorshkov in the White Sea fired a Tsirkon hypersonic cruise missile, hitting a naval target 450 km away in the Barents Sea at a speed of over Mach 8, Xinhua news agency quoted the Ministry as saying.

In early January, the same frigate test-fired a Tsirkon missile for the first time, striking a ground target over 500 km away.

Last month, the warship deployed in the White Sea destroyed a naval target in the Barents Sea with a Tsirkon missile. (Read more)

Who: YES Bank

What: launches SMS Pay functionality through POS Terminals

When: published on 26<sup>th</sup> November 2020

Private lender YES Bank launched an SMS Pay functionality on POS terminals, which enables merchants to accept contactless payments from customers. The lender said the facility was launched in collaboration with French payment services company Worldline, adding that the facility would allow merchants to accept remote payments on POS terminals and thus allow customers to transact safely and remotely.

YES Bank in a statement said local merchants & department stores could request payments from their customers by entering their contact details in the POS terminal following which an SMS would be triggered with a generated link, that would be used to pay through domestic debit and credit cards.
