Directions: Read the following information carefully and answer the questions given beside.

In a party, host Akhilesh Verma decided to give a return gift to his guests. He bought some items viz. Ring, Dress, Chocolates, Jewellery, Wallet and Shoes to give as return gift to his guests viz. Shivam, Romil, Deepak, Megha, Karan and Surbhi not necessarily in the same order. These gift items were stacked one above another in an almirah where the topmost rack is numbered as 6 and the bottom most rack is numbered as 1. It is also known that Dress given to Surbhi was kept at an odd numbered position. The gift item for Deepak was kept just above the Ring which was at 4th position. The gift item for Karan was kept adjacent to the gift item given to Surbhi. Shoes were kept above Ring, but was not for Deepak. Chocolates which were given to Megha were not kept in second rack. Wallet was given to Romil but was not kept in 3rd rack.

These gift items were stacked one above another in an almirah where the topmost rack is numbered as 6 and the bottom most rack is numbered as 1.

The gift item for Deepak was kept just above the Ring which was at 4th position.

Shoes were kept above Ring, but was not for Deepak.

With the given hints we can prepare the following table.

It is also known that Dress given to Surbhi was kept at an odd numbered position.

The gift item for Karan was kept adjacent to the gift item given to Surbhi.

Inference:

The only left odd numbered poistions are Rack numbers 1 and 3, so we will apply both the hints in form of Case-I and Case-II.

Chocolates which were given to Megha were not kept in second rack.

Wallet was given to Romil but was not kept in 3rd rack.

Thus, the only left person Shivam was given Shoes and the only left item Jewellery was given to Deepak.

Explanation:

1. Shoes was given to Shivam.

Hence option B is correct.

2. 4 gift items were placed below Jewellery.

Hence option E is correct.

3. Ring i.e. The gift given to Karan was placed exactly between the gift given to Romil i.e. Wallet and Shoes.

Hence option C is correct.

4. Megha - Chocolates - 3 is the wrongly matched combination. Thus the odd one out because all others are correctly matched.

Hence option D is correct.









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
